

Series ~ What Is The Church?

TITLE ~ "The Assembly, Part 2"

TEACHER ~ John-Thomas Richards

Text \sim Acts 2:42-47

There are number of commands given in the New Testament that cannot be obeyed apart from the church. We must love one another (Rom 13:8), accept one another (Rom 15:7), associate with one another (Rom 12:16), bear one another's burdens (Gal 6:2), have fellowship with one another (1 John 1:7), be kind and compassionate to one another (Eph 4:32), serve one another (Gal 5:13). We cannot do these things apart from one another. That is, none of these can be done properly from a distance.

In the church, then, we spend time together. What does that actually look like? Today we will examine what the first church in Jerusalem did while together and we will see what that means for us today.

Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

(Hebrews 10:19-25 ESV)

ANNOUNCEMENTS

MEMBERSHIP

Interested in becoming a member of New City Church? Wondering what is required? The following requirements are from Article 5 Section 1 Paragraph A of the New City Church Constitution:

- A To qualify for membership in New City Church, a person must:
- Be a follower of Jesus Christ and exhibit evidence of regeneration;
- Be a regular attender and committed to New City Church;
- Submit to the teaching of Scripture as expressed in the Statement of Faith;
- Serve the church with the spiritual gift(s) given by the Holy Spirit for the church;
- Participate in fellowship and in community with other members of the church.

Membership carries with it both privileges and duties. Article 5 Section 3 Paragraph A lists them.

- A Each member of the church shall have the privilege and duty to:
- Submit himself or herself to the authority of the Scriptures to regulate his or her life and doctrine;
- Faithfully and regularly attend regular and special meetings of the church;
- Accept and fellowship with all members of the church;
- Use his or her spiritual gift(s) given by the Holy Spirit for the benefit of the church:
- Give of his or her finances cheerfully and sacrificially to the church for the work of the ministry;
- Submit to the authority of the Council of Elders;
- Abide by the Membership Covenant.

Today we will explore some of the rationale behind these requirements. We will explore how a church is supposed to function and what the very tangible benefits are of being Christ's church in this place.

COMMUNION

We celebrate communion each week as a regular reminder that our faith and our salvation is not in any way based on us or our behavior, but solely on the finished work of Jesus Christ and his mercy and grace extended to us through it. All who are followers of Jesus may participate in the celebration of communion. If you are not a follower of Jesus or are not prepared to participate, simply pass the tray of bread and juice without taking any.

WORSHIP STYLE

The apostle Paul instructs us to teach one another by "singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs" (Col 3:16). While the instruments or style of music may not be vour preference, we trust that the rich theology in the worship music will strengthen and encourage you today. We are very intentional to choose songs that cause us to focus on Jesus as we are here to worship him and him alone. Expression in worship varies from person to person. Feel free to raise your hands, to stand, to sit. More important than physical expression of worship is our true worship, a heart that is engaged with the majesty of God.
