

WORSHIP AT NEW CITY CHURCH

One thing you should notice about our service is that we are here to worship Jesus together. Each element of our service is designed to encourage worship of him in some way. There are seven elements that are included in each service. They are listed below with a brief explanation of each.

SONGS

Scripture instructs us to teach one another in "psalms and hymns and spiritual songs" (Colossians 3:16). As a regular part of our worship services we sing songs to God—songs that are about God. We are very intentional in choosing songs that strengthen our faith in some way by teaching us what God is like or what God has done.

PRAYER

Since we worship God in our services, it makes sense that we also communicate to him. This happens a number of times each service, though most of the prayers are shorter in length. However, each Sunday we offer a "Pastoral Prayer" in which one of the Elders of the church prays for various people with needs in the church.

OFFERING

Each week we collect an offering. Paul instructed the church in ancient Corinth to collect their offerings on the first day of every week. In that tradition we collect an offering to support the ministry of New City Church. This is a voluntary gift to God via the church. As Paul instructed the Corinthians, "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7).

GREETING

Scripture instructs believers to greet one another with a kiss (Romans 16:16, 1 Corinthians 13:12, 1 Peter 5:14). Kissing was a cultural expression in Paul's day yet greeting one another transcends culture. We take a few minutes of our service to greet one another with a handshake, fistbump, hug, or just a warm welcome.

READING SCRIPTURE

Paul instructed Timothy to be devoted to the public reading of Scripture (1 Timothy 4:13). We think he meant it so we include a reading each week (separate from the sermon text).

PREACHING

God has given us a written record of the revelation of Jesus Christ. Since this is a primary way God speaks to us today, we spend about a third of our time together with a sermon from God's Word. You can expect the sermon to explain what the text is saying, and then applying it to our context so that we can hear what God is saying to us through the text. Whether we are working through a book from the New Testament or from the Old, we believe all Scripture points us to Jesus so each sermon is ultimately about him (see the Gospel of Luke 24:44-48).

COMMUNION / BAPTISM

The night before his death Jesus transformed the annual Passover celebration into a regular event to commemorate his death and resurrection. The frequency of this celebration is a matter of freedom; at New City we choose to celebrate communion each week. All who are followers of Jesus are welcome to participate (see 1 Corinthians 11:23-26).

We also celebrate baptism as men and women make public professions of faith in Jesus. Baptism illustrates the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus as the new believer is immersed into a pool of water. This celebration takes place during our regular worship services.

ACTIVITIES AT NEW CITY

New City is not a program-driven church. We believe that discipleship happens in relationship as God's people spend time with others. Rather than fill your week with church activities we want to make sure you have time to spend with others, whether a neighbor or a co-worker or a family member as you seek to share the good news of Jesus. We want to follow the model in Titus 2 where the apostle Paul instructs men and women to live godly lives and spend time in relationship with people. Those who are mature in the faith ought to seek out those who are not; those who are not ought to seek out those who are. Invite someone to lunch or to a basketball game or have a game night at your home and break out Scrabble or Checkers. Spend time with others and share the good news of Jesus in the context of friendship.

CITY GROUPS

Want to really get to know people in the church? Join a City Group! City Groups are small groups that meet in a home regularly for a meal and a Bible study and lots of fun. We have several groups available that meet on different nights of the week. All are welcome to join. Please note that City Groups are not limited by stage-of-life, age, or any other factor, so as to better reflect the diversity of the church. For more information see Pastor J-T.

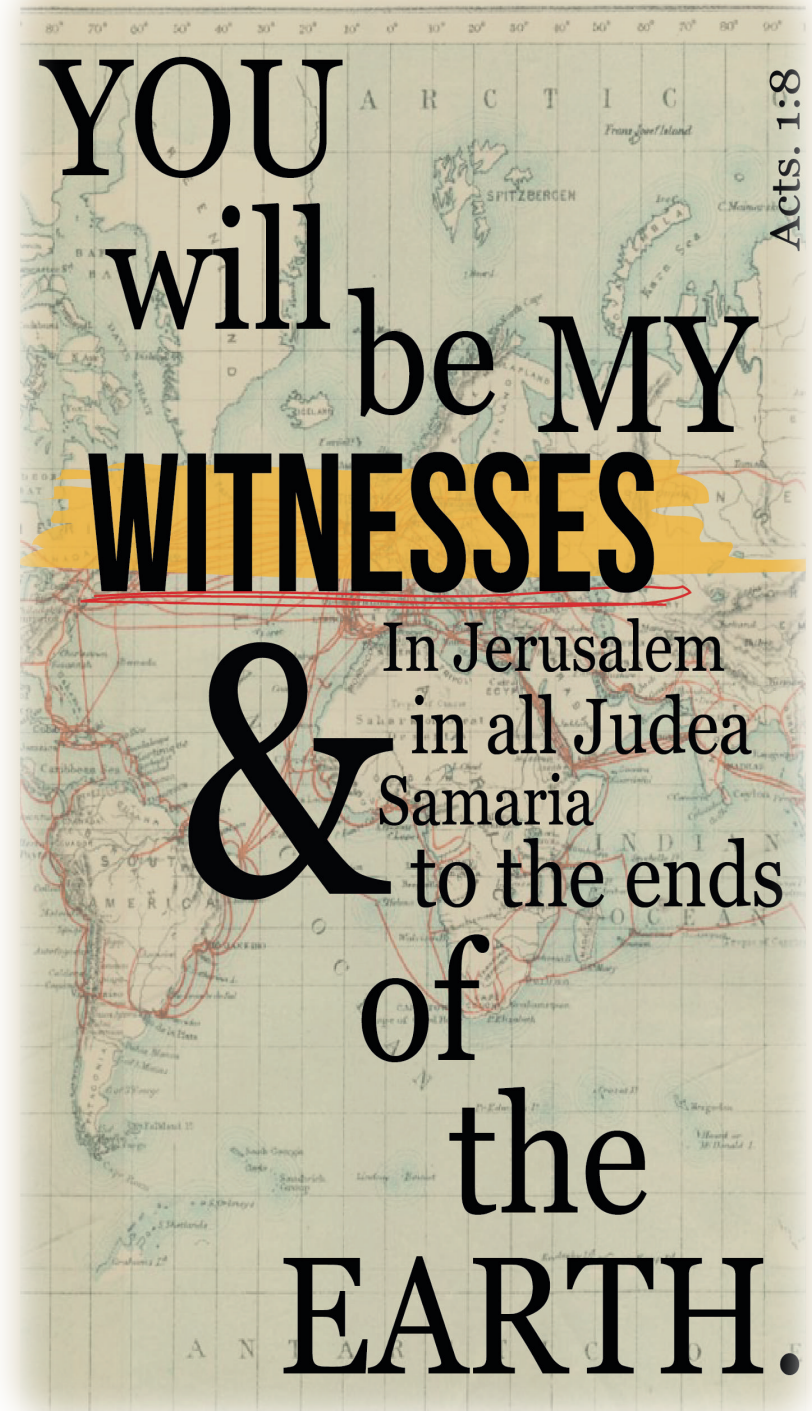
